

Leaving a Legacy to the Gorilla Organization

By remembering the Gorilla Organization in your Will, you are helping to ensure that gorillas and their forest home are protected for generations to come – a truly special gift.

You don't have to be wealthy to leave a legacy, and legacy gifts to the Gorilla Organization come in all shapes and sizes. But every gift makes a real difference in the protection of gorillas in their natural habitat for future generations.

You can choose to leave a **pecuniary** or cash legacy – this is a specific amount that you include in your Will. Or you might prefer to leave a proportion of your estate once your family and friends have been provided for. This type of gift is a **residuary** legacy.

Below is the suggested wording to use when including the Gorilla Organization in your Will – a Will is a legal document and so you should always seek legal advice when making or changing your will.

Pecuniary legacy

“I give the sum of £ (*enter figure & words*) to the Gorilla Organization, 110 Gloucester Avenue, London NW1 8HX, UK, registered charity 1117131 to be used for its general purposes and I direct that the receipt of the Treasurer or duly authorised officer shall be sufficient discharge to my executors.”

Residuary legacy

“I give all (*or amount %*) of the residue of my estate to the Gorilla Organization, 110 Gloucester Avenue, London NW1 8HX, UK, registered charity 1117131 to be used for its general charitable purposes and I direct that the receipt of the Treasurer or duly authorised officer shall be sufficient discharge to my executors.”
